


THE FERTILE PRAIRIES IN ILLINOIS ATTRACTED THE ATTENTION OF FRENCH TRADER LOUIS JOLLIET AND FATHER HISTORY ACQUES MARQUETTE AS THEY EXPLORED THE MISSISSIPPI AND ILLINOIS RIVERS IN 1673. FRANCE CLAIMED HIS REGION UNTIL 1763 WHEN SHE SURRENDERED IT TO GREAT BRITAIN BY THE TREATY OF PARIS. DURING THE IMPRICAN REVOLUTION, GEORGE ROGERS CLARK AND HIS SMALL ARMY SCOMED A BLOODLESS VICTORY WHEN HEY CAPTURED KASKASKIA FOR THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA. AND ILLINOIS BECAME A COUNTY OF VIRGINIA. THIS AREA WAS CEDED TO THE UNITED STATES IN 1784, AND BECAME IN TURN A PART OF THE INTEREST THE INTEREST STATE.

U.S. 36 TOUCHES SIX COUNTIES WHICH WERE PART OF THE EIGHTH JUDICIAL CURCUIT. FROM 1839 TO 1860 ABRAHAM LINCOLN FOLLOWED THE COURT AS IT MOVED FROM COUNTY SEAT TO COUNTY SEAT WITHIN THE CIRCUIT THUS HE CAME TO SUCH CITIES AS PARIS. SULLIVAN. MONTICELLO. DECATUR AND SPRINGFIELD FOR THE BI-ANNUAL TERMS.

WEST OF DECATUR THIS HIGHWAY PASSES NEAR THE LINCOLN TRAIL HOMESTEAD STATE PARK ON THE BANKS OF THE SANGAMON RIVER THIS WAS THE SITE OF THE FIRST LINCOLN HOME IN ILLINOIS WHEN THE FAMILY AME FROM INDIANA IN 1830. THE FOLLOWING SPRING THOMAS LINCOLN MOVED TO COLES COUNTY AND ABRAHAM MOVED ON TO NEW SALEM, 20 MILES NORTHWEST OF SPRINGFIELD. U.S. 36 PASSES THROUGH SPRINGFIELD WHERE LINCOLN'S HOME AND TOMB ARE STATE MEMORIALS. SPRINGFIELD IS ALSO THE SITE OF THE OLD STATE CAPITOL WHERE LINCOLN DELIVERED HIS FAMOUS "HOUSE DIVIDED" SPEECH.

- "Old" Archaeology, c.13,000 BP, Beringea
- Archaeology, 15,000BP? 35,000BP? Etc.?

Three critical terms

- Ethnocentrism (and Eurocentrism)
- Historiography
- Syncretism

Syncretism

- Putting things together from two or more cultures
- Examples: Xmas, foods (Boston baked beans, gumbo, Szechuan, Italian, etc.!)
- Example: Plains Indian culture
- False choice: be Native or be American

Why Did Europe Win? Syncretism!

- Gunpowder from China
- Caravels from Egypt
- Bookkeeping ("Arabic numerals") from India
- Drill from Europe
- Portable religion from Palestine

Earlier storyline:

Native Americans were primitive.

"We" were advanced.

"Naturally" they fell behind.

BS!

"Nicer" storyline:

Native Americans had diverse interesting cultures.

But they could not or would not acculturate.

So, "naturally," they fell behind.

BS!

"Couldn't/wouldn't Acculturate"




Chief Joseph Vann house: Failure to Acculturate?








"Primitive," "Civilized"

Pequot Massacre







Later we spent >\$30 million buying it from Native Americans and we fought at least two dozen battle raking it from them.



Washington 'Redskins'?

- The team started out as the Boston Braves.
- Owner George Marshall changed to "Redskins" to differentiate his team from the Boston Braves baseball team (now in Atlanta).
- He said he meant it as a compliment to American Indians (Native Americans).
- Should the name stand?

What do we think about "the Atlanta Niggers?" the "New York City Kikes?" the "Chicago Polacks?" the "Washington Redskins"

Need more information?

- Some Natives and historians claim "redskins" stems from the requirement to show the scalp or other part of a Native to claim a bounty, in colonial times, for killing an enemy.
- Over half of Native Americans do not claim to be offended by the name.
- Would we say, "There are two 'redskins' in Congress at present?

Columbus Day?

When Congress was making it a holiday in 1963, Rep.Roland Libonati said, "His Christian faith gave to him a religious incentive to thwart the piratical activities of the Turkish marauders preying upon the trading ships of the Christian world."

Columbus started the trans-Atlantic slave trade, from west to east (of Natives). His son started it from east to west (of Africans).

- Who is "comforted" by it?




"Savage Indians"

The Nadir, 1890-1940




The Worst Time for History: The Nadir of Race Relations

- Racism (as ideology) to all-time high
- 1890-1940
- "Three I's"
 - Indian Wars
 - Immigrants (San Francisco, Ellis Island)
 - Imperialism



"Muscuitine Tribe #95, Improved Order of Red Men, 1926. Nadir of Native Americans: 244,000; "Red Men," 500,000. Natives could not be "Red Men," of course.

A different kind of hieratic scale



George Rogers Clark, warrior against Native Americans, Charlottesville, Virginia

Legacies of the Nadir Today in "Indian Country"

- 1. Allotment, loss of land base, weakening of tribal government
- 2. Natives viewed as inferior
- 3. "Standardized testing"

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Syncretism

Examples:

- Christmas
- Gumbo; Szechuan, Hunan, and Thai food; spaghetti sauce; etc.
- Democracy!
- Inuit art
- [What will they think of next?]

Go Syncretize!:

- America is not a "white" culture.
- It is multicultural.
- Whites don't have all the answers.
- We need you! In architecture, medicine, poetry, restaurants, political decision-making, living!


Leaving out what Vasco da Gama did makes a difference.


U.S. history is still "white."
